

EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The CSU College of Education offers highly accredited licensure programs and elite scholarships to outstanding undergraduate students. Students who earn the College and Career Pathway Endorsement (CCPE) in Education and apply for these awards are automatically advanced as finalists:

- Diverse Scholars in Education Scholarship
 Geared towards students seeking to teach in an
 urban education setting, Diverse Scholars receive
 a full-tuition scholarship for up to 4 years. This
 scholarship also comes with weekly academic
 advising sessions, dedicated faculty program
 mentor, and summer internship opportunities.
- Call Me Mister Program

The prestigious national program, Mentors Instructing Students Toward Effective Role models (MISTER), increases the number of diverse, male teacher candidates becoming teachers in under-served, urban communities. Participants receive a **full-tuition scholarship**, weekly academic support sessions, program mentor, and access to monthly activities related to the profession.

APPLYING AS A FRESHMAN?

All freshmen qualify for *Rise* Academy, a full-tuition scholarship and student support program for your freshmen year. Honor's students can also receive a full-tuition scholarship.

- Upon acceptance into CSU, apply for the scholarships.
- Normally, candidates must be in good academic standing with a 3.0 or higher GPA in high school or while enrolled in college to be eligible for these scholarships. This requirement is waived if students have earned the College and **Career Pathway Endorsement** in Education on their high school diploma. Please make sure to submit a copy of your high school transcript with the endorsement and highlight that experience in your essays for the scholarship applications.
