YMCA was instrumental in recruiting industry professionals for the event and ensuring that each career included on their regional program of study was represented. Attendees convened in a large room to learn about the programs available at Joliet Junior College, including financial support and scholarship opportunities to fund their education. Representatives from the Illinois Student Assistance Commission were available to discuss the FAFSA process, and representatives from Joliet Junior College were
